## HOME AT THE END

## -SCENE EXCERPT-

## ACT TWO - SCENE ONE.

Flat, grey walls. Clean, bland space. JOE in a hospital bed with a drip, isolated. A dressing on his shoulder. He wears nothing but a patient's gown.

A rubber ball rolls into view. JOE stares at it neutrally. MOLLY then enters, chasing it down. JOE does not react to her presence. Once she captures the ball, she sits down and quietly plays with it, in the middle of the floor.

ANDIE enters, as a NURSE. Neither pay any attention to MOLLY. For them she is not there. She checks the drip, checks his pulse, writes in the chart, gives him medication, and so on.

JOE (after a while) What, what happened?

ANDIE (*as she goes about her nursing duties*) Well, he got us, Joe. Molly and me. While you were in the bathroom. Shot us, killed us dead. Bang bang, and all that.

JOE Are, are you sure?

ANDIE Oh yes, it's a done deal, Joe, I'm afraid. No going back now. 'Course, it wasn't just us. Many, many more. Men, women, children. Terrible.

JOE But not me?

ANDIE Not you, Joe. Not you, my love. Now, now, stop that, don't cry, no need to cry. No need to cry, my beautiful man. Let me have a look at your shoulder, thank you. Healing nicely. Quite lucky you were, really. Two rounds went through the plaster wall, into the bathroom. One merely grazed your ear. The other, lodged in your shoulder. It's out now, of course, once they operated. Very lucky.

JOE	Lucky?
ANDIE	Let's have none of that now. Let's call it luck and move on.
JOE	Molly?
ANDIE	I told you before, Joe.
JOE Don't go, Mo	( <i>calls out weakly to her</i> ) Molly. ( <i>but</i> MOLLY <i>picks up the ball and leaves</i> ) lly, come play with daddy. Come back and play with daddy.
ANDIE	She's not there, Joe.
JOE	(reaching out and holding ANDIE's hand) You, you won't leave, will you?

ANDIE (stares at his hand on hers, then gently places her other hand on his, becoming not ANDIE, but the NURSE, and gently:) I need my hand back to pour you some water. Mr. Smith? Mr. Smith.

JOE You... you, you remind me of my wife.

NURSE I'm sure she's much prettier than me.

JOE (*absently*) Yes.

NURSE And I'll need you to take these three pills, Mr. Smith. There's an antiinflammatory for your shoulder, I love you Joe, and the two panadeine-forte will help with the discomfort, and help you sleep. I need to tell you that there's a police officer outside who wants to ask you a few questions, but anytime you want to stop, or if you start feeling sleepy, why did you do it Joe, you just tell him so and he'll stop. You can also call myself or the doctor on your call button. Dr. Wicks will also be there – do you remember Dr. Wicks, Mr. Smith? He had a brief chat with you after your second operation. (JOE *thinks, but shakes his head*) He'll be on hand if it all gets a bit upsetting for you.

JOE	Andie?
NURSE	That's the name of your wife, isn't it?
JOE	Yes.

NURSE Could you swallow those pills for me please, Mr. Smith? (*he does so, with her assistance*) That's great, and if you can lean forward for me, I'll just position your pillows so you're a little more upright. (*he does so*) There. (*she kisses him on the mouth*) Remember what I told you, Mr. Smith. Anytime you feel tired or disorientated or upset, you tell the police officer or Dr. Hicks or just press your call-button. Are you ready? Alright, I'll leave now, and let them in. (*backing away*) Stay calm, Joe, stay calm baby.

JOE Wait. Please.

ANDIE (*as she leaves*) On the count of three, Joe, Three, Two, One, Go. POLICE VOICES flood the room. They continually over-lap, repeat, echo – a montage of interrogation)
